





## Chateau de Lescours St Emilion Grand Cru



## 2010 Vintage

80% Merlot, 10% Cabernet Sauvignon, 10% Cabernet Franc

Deep, black fruit aromas on the nose with a touch of sweet cherries. The palate is tender and soft with ripe fruit. The finish is fresh and elegant. Clearly a wine with excellent aging potential.

The vines are planted on a sandy, gravel soil with an average of 45 years old and some as old as 100 years. Traditional fermentation takes place over a 25-30 day period. The wine is then aged 18 months in oak barrels



One of the oldest and most renowned properties in the Saint-Emilion district, Château de Lescours was built in 1341 by a squire of King Edward III. This 18 acre Grand Cru estate has been owned by the Chariol family for 4 generations.
